## ORDER

It is informed by Learned Counsel for respondent no.8 that incompliance of the order dated 10.12.2018, the amount of environmental compensation has been deposited with CPCB. He may file the receipt on record along with an affidavit. Learned Counsel for Rajasthan PCB also submits that they have also complied with the order dated 10.12.2018 and to substantiate the same they filed an affidavit along with the receipt of the amount of compensation deposited.

## <u>M.A. No. 1778/2018</u>

This misc. application has been filed by respondent no.8. However, the Learned Counsel for the applicant prays that he may be permitted to withdraw the application, so as to file an exhaustive application. Therefore, misc. application no. 1778/2018 is dismissed as withdrawn, with liberty to the Applicant as aforesaid.

Having regard to the earlier proceedings and the orders which have been passed in this case, we deem it proper to constitute a Committee which shall inspect the site and give update of present situation at the site. Therefore, we request Dr. Ajay Deshpande and Prof. A.P. Singh, to visit the site and give the Tribunal the present position. They shall also examine the functioning of

ETPs(111); CETPs(3); HRTs and any other facility in the area of Bituja, Balotra and Jasol which they deem proper to examine. Such report may be filed within one month.

The remuneration of the Committee would be at Rs. 1 lakhs, to each Member and all other expenses like logistic, photography etc. shall be borne by the respondent no.8 at this stage. Subsequently, the amount and expenses incurred in the visit of the Committee may be modified, if deemed necessary.

The Committee is directed to submit the report latest by 10.02.2019 and send a soft copy to the Registry. The Registry shall thereafter upload the report on the website of the NGT. The parties would be at liberty to file response to the report, before the next date of hearing.
